

2010 Indiana Quarter Horse Association 4-H Horse Award

The Indiana Quarter Horse Association will give a registered Quarter Horse to a 4-H member, Monday, August 9, 2010, during the Indiana State Fair 4-H Horse and Pony Show. Any Indiana 4-H member enrolled in the Horse & Pony project, who is in 3rd to 11th grade on January 1, 2010, may apply. The winner must exhibit the awarded horse as his/her 4-H project in 2011. Each Indiana County may submit as many applications as there are interested applicants.

The Indiana Quarter Horse Association sponsors this annual award program in order to: (1) provide recognition to ten deserving 4-H horse/pony members; (2) provide one 4-H'er each year the opportunity to own and train a registered Quarter Horse; and (3) generate additional exposure for the Indiana Quarter Horse Association.

Finalists will be chosen from the applicants and will be invited to the State Fair for the personal interviews. The finalists **must be present** for the award ceremony on Monday, August 9, 2010. *Due to schedule of the award, it is highly advised, but not prohibited, that a finalist not exhibit at the State Fair on the day of the interview and award presentation.* A winner will be selected from these finalists using the following criteria: (1) knowledge of horses/ponies; (2) facilities available to keep a registered Quarter Horse; (3) ability to take proper care of the Quarter Horse; and (4) need of a Quarter Horse to further his/her learning experiences.

Note: A 4-H member may only win one state award horse/pony during his/her 4-H career. This does not include Horse Bowl, Hippology, Horse Judging, or State Fair class wins.

To be considered the 4-H'er must complete the application as follows:

1. Fill in the information requested (complete) at the bottom of this page. Use a pen; not a pencil. Typed is okay also.
2. Answer the ten questions in the space provided using a pen or typed. Do not use additional sheets of paper.
3. Attach a copy of "My Record of 4-H Achievement". If the enrollment county does not use "My Record of 4-H Achievement" cards, a letter from the county extension office must accompany this application.
4. Have the application signed by your parent/guardian and 4-H leader to be accepted. Take the completed application and an addressed, stamped envelope to your 4-H adult leader **by May 20, 2010. The application must be signed and mailed (post marked; no hand delivered applications will be considered) by June 1, 2010.**
